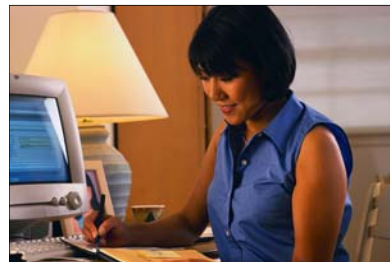

What is expected of students?

- Six courses of study (Sept-March)
- 8 month program
- 6 assignments and six final exams
- A final essay
- All course work is only available online and all assignments must be submitted electronically. All final exams are taken online using a private testing service.
- Mandatory Meetings
 - TRF / WCS Seminar (Oct.)
 - Mid-Year District Meeting (Jan)
 - District Assembly (April)
 - Final Seminar & Graduation (May)
- Timely submission of all assignments. Courses last one month and must be completed during that time. The final exam for each course must be taken before proceeding to the next course. Students falling 30+ days behind may be dropped from the program with the option to complete the program the following year.



How does someone enroll?

- Past Presidents are eligible for admission as are others who are nominated by the DG or DGE.
- Admission is by nomination only.
- Nominations may be submitted by DG's, PDG's, AG's, Rotary Clubs and Academy graduates
- Class is limited to 20 students. Non Past Presidents admitted on space available basis only.
